Fiscal Year 2014 Annual HUB Report Supplemental Summary for Agency 580


The Texas Water Development Board (TWDB) is dedicated to supporting the Historically Underutilized Business (HUB) program by actively seeking HUB participation in all procurement opportunities. As a result of our *good faith efforts* in soliciting HUBs, the TWDB conducted more than 408 transactions with HUB vendors in various procurement categories. In addition, the TWDB also put forth the following efforts to increase HUB participation throughout fiscal year 2014:

- Rebid Underwriter, Financial Analyst and Bond Council Contracts;
- Successfully added 31 new HUB Vendors to the TWDBs vendor pool;
- Participated in economic opportunity forums, spot bid fairs, and business networking sessions held around the state;
- Emphasized and increased outreach and marketing efforts to educate current HUB vendors on specific TWDB procurement opportunities;
- Assisted interested HUB vendors with the state's HUB certification process, and with the processes of other recognized certification programs;
- Attended pre-bid meetings to ensure that potential responders understand and comply with applicable HUB subcontracting plan requirements;
- Served as a liaison between the Board's purchasing staff and interested HUB vendors interested in introducing and showcasing their goods and services;
- Posted to the agency's website, online information and guidance related to the HUB program.

The TWDB also had additional minority and women owned business use and participation in other areas of business, which is not reflected in the agency's HUB expenditure report. This includes:

- Administration of the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) program authorized by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). As a recipient of EPA federal loans and grants, the TWDB implemented and currently administers the DBE program consistent with federal regulations.
- Throughout the bond distribution process, four minority owned firms participated on the transactions as co-managers and submitted orders in the amount of \$35,290,000 and were allotted \$2,100,000 in bonds.
- Payments to HiPIDS Vendor, Gorrondona & Associates, were not accounted for due to object code reclassification;

The TWDB fully supports the idea that all qualified businesses deserve the opportunity to compete in the State's procurement process, and is committed to increasing the potential for HUB participation in all TWDB expenditures. To that extent, we will continue current efforts that have proven successful, and explore new opportunities wherever possible.
