Supplemental Letter to the FY 2014 Semi-Annual HUB Report for Agency 303

The Texas Facilities Commission (TFC) remains committed to increasing economic opportunities for Historically Underutilized Businesses (HUB's). During the first six months of FY 2014, TFC made the following outreach and good faith efforts:

- Attended and presented at the annual conferences of the Texas Association of Mexican American (TAMACC) and Texas Association of African American (TAAACC) Chambers of Commerce.
- Contributed as a standing member of the Memorandum of Cooperation (MOC) with TAAACC and TAMAAC partner meetings hosted by the University of Texas.
- Participated as an exhibitor at the Houston Minority Supplier Development Council's Annual Business Expo.
- Attended the Texas Council of HUB's (TCH) Small Business Advocacy Forum.
- Spearheaded a professional services Meet the Prime networking event, in which over one-hundred (100) minority businesses engaged with awarded prime firms for potential subcontracting opportunities.
- Partnered with the City of Houston's Public Works Engineering Department to host a collaborative Professional Services Forum entitled "Design your Future." The forum included informative presentations and one-on-one networking with agency decision-makers and City of Houston personnel.
- Active member of the HUB Discussion Workgroup and attends regular meetings.
- Served as a presenter and participated in a business matchmaking session during the Professional Services Advisory Committee meeting hosted by the African American statewide chamber of commerce in Fort Worth.
- Actively engaged in managing TFC's Mentor Protégé program agreement(s).
- Facilitated approximately thirty-two (32) HUB vendor introductory meetings; providing HUBs the opportunity to directly interact with TFC project managers and procurement staff.
- Presents HUB requirements at all pre-proposal/pre-submittal meetings.
