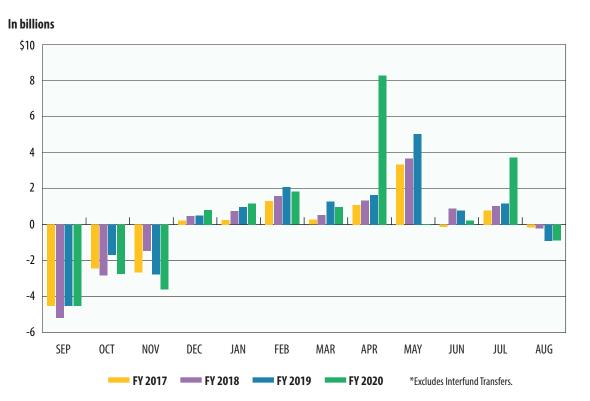


GENERAL REVENUE FUND DAILY BALANCES*



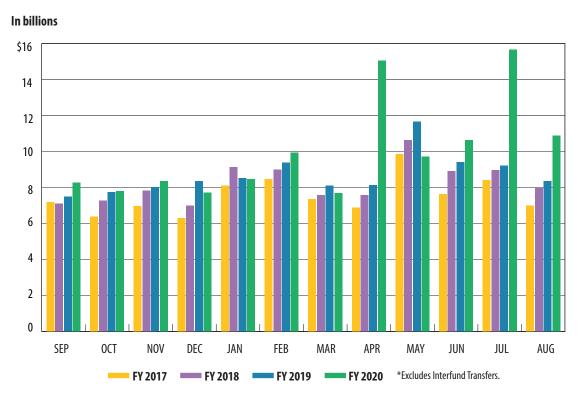


GENERAL REVENUE FUND NET CASH FLOW*



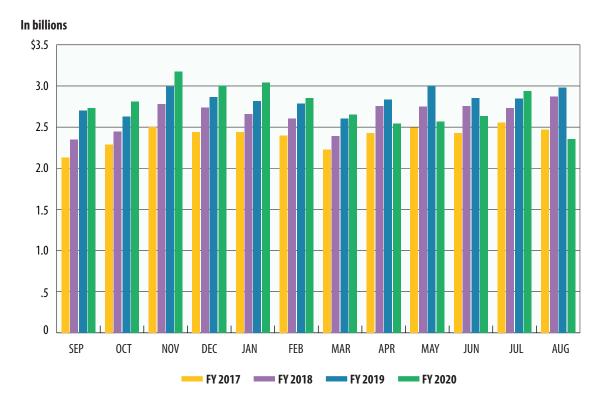


TOTAL REVENUE*



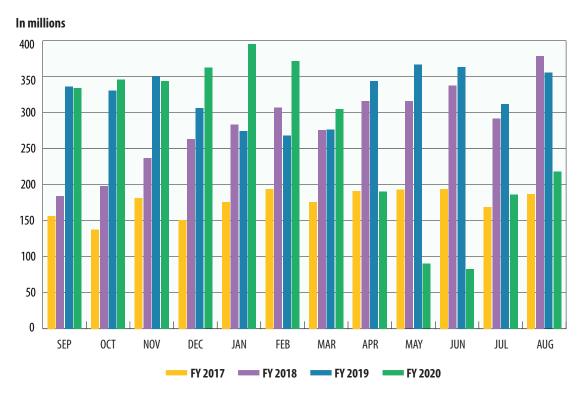


SALES TAX



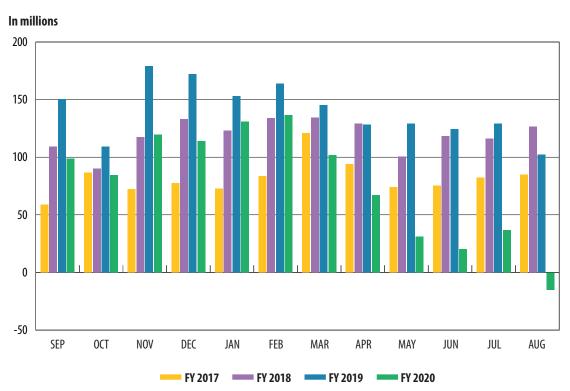


OIL PRODUCTION TAX



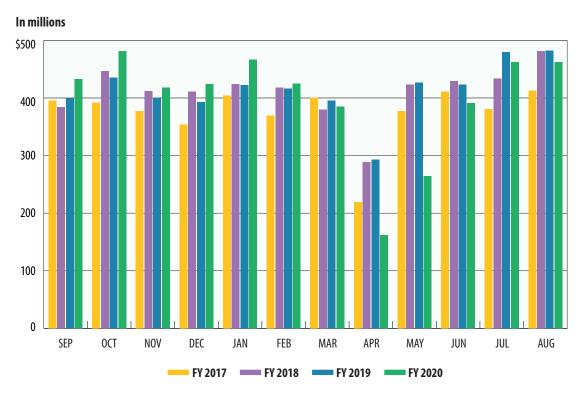


NATURAL GAS PRODUCTION TAX



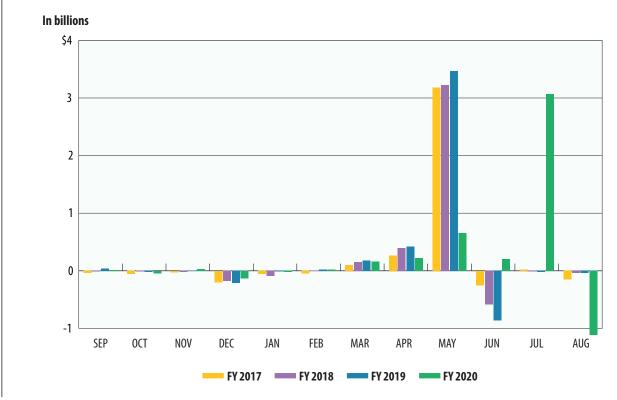


MOTOR VEHICLE SALES/RENTAL TAX



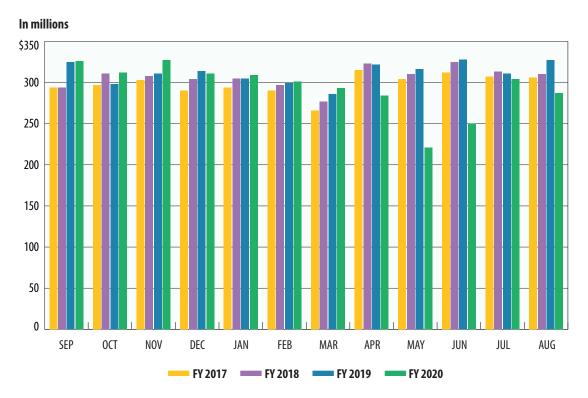


FRANCHISE TAX



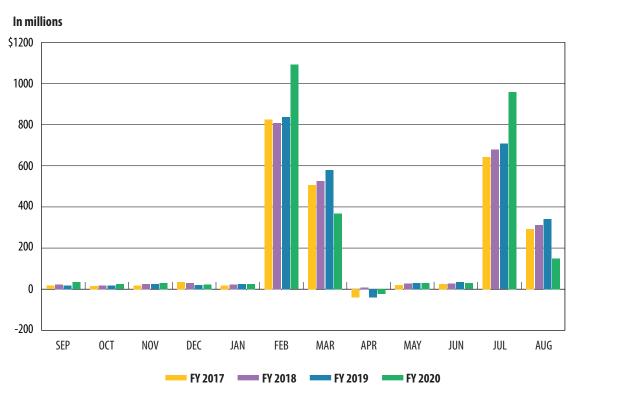


MOTOR FUELS TAXES



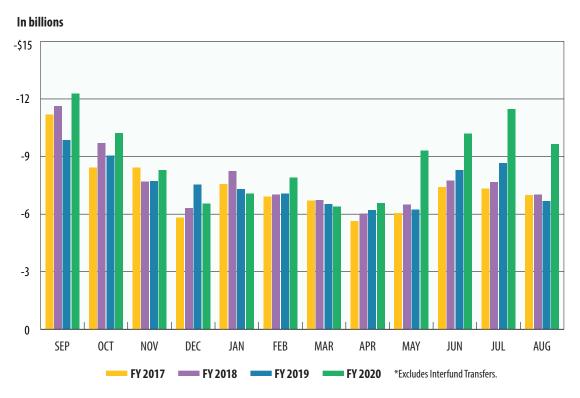


INSURANCE TAXES



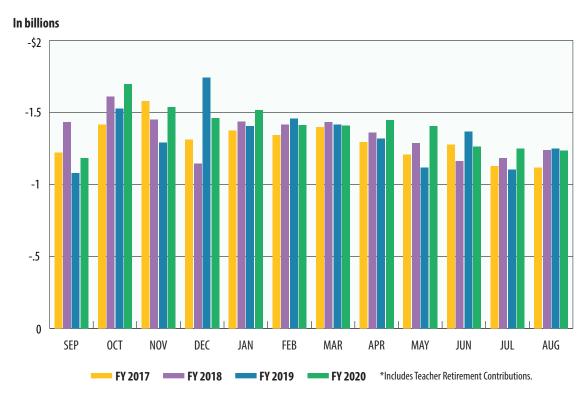


TOTAL EXPENDITURES*



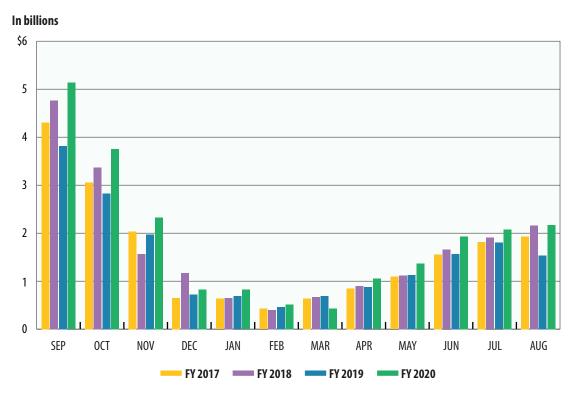


PAYROLL/BENEFITS EXPENDITURES*



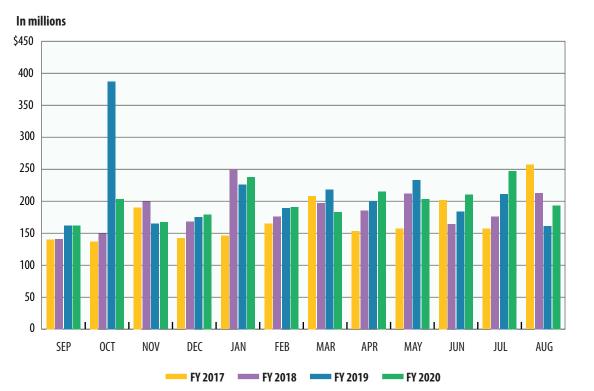


PUBLIC EDUCATION EXPENDITURES



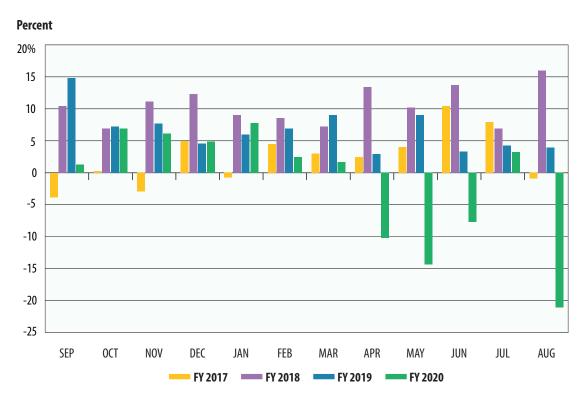


LOTTERY TICKET SALES



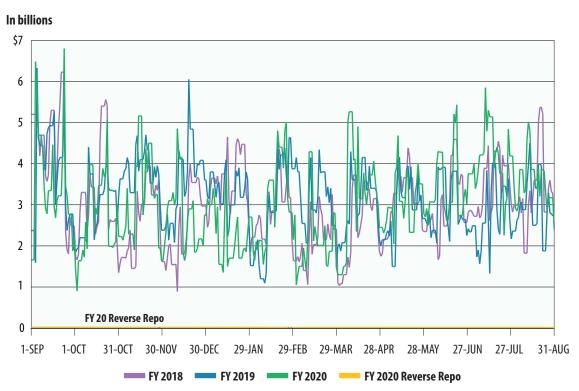
