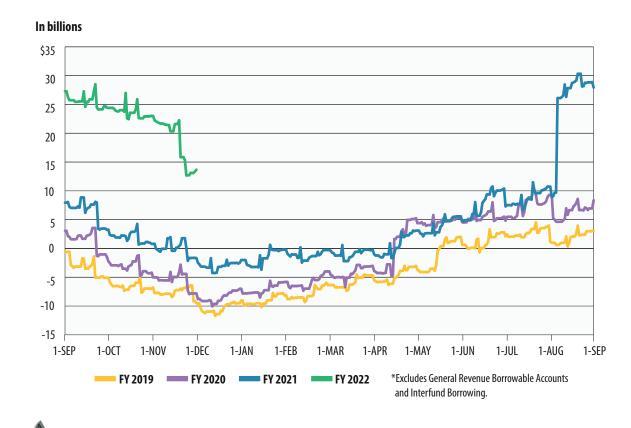

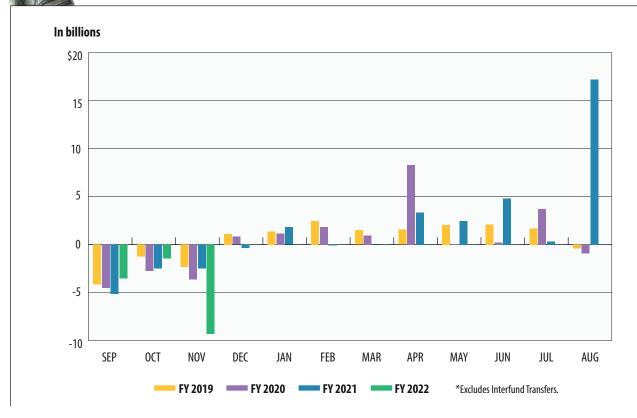

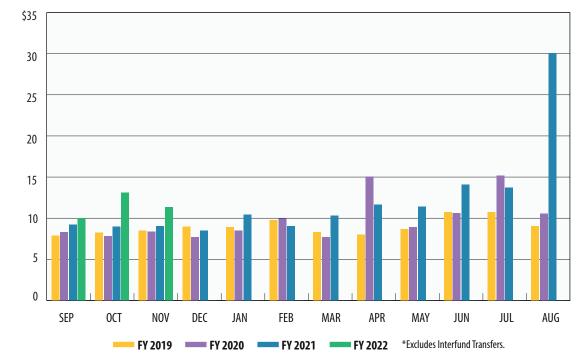


GENERAL REVENUE FUND NET CASH FLOW*



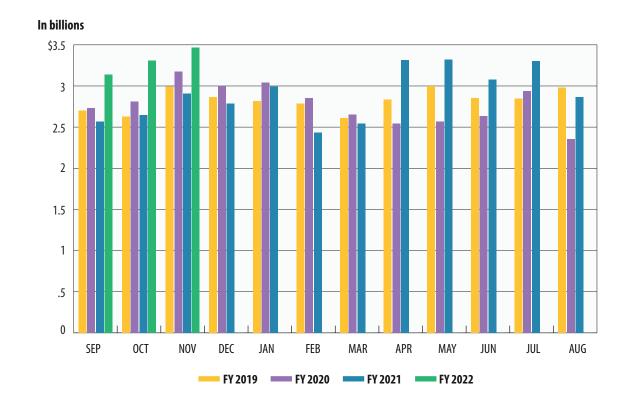

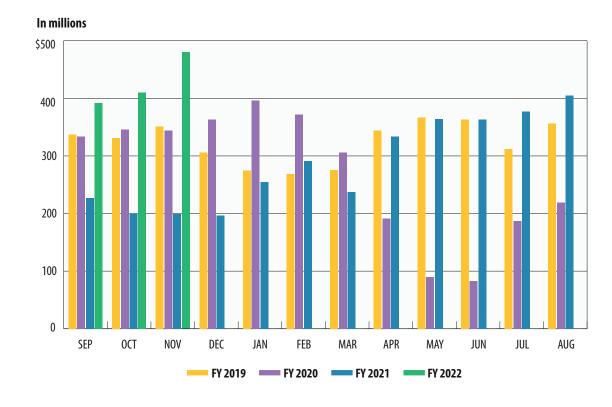


SALES TAX



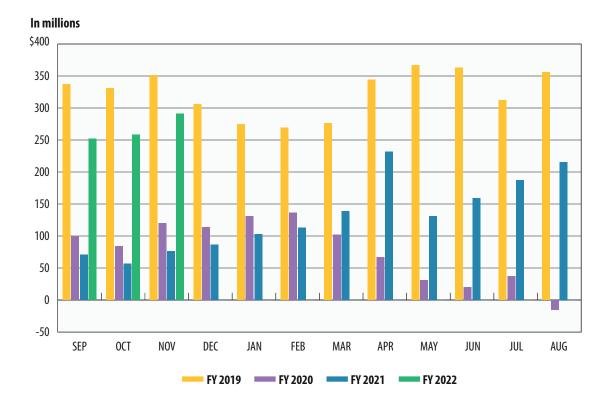


OIL PRODUCTION TAX



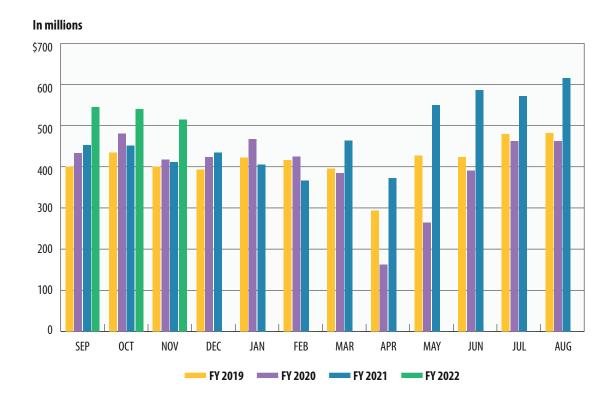


NATURAL GAS PRODUCTION TAX



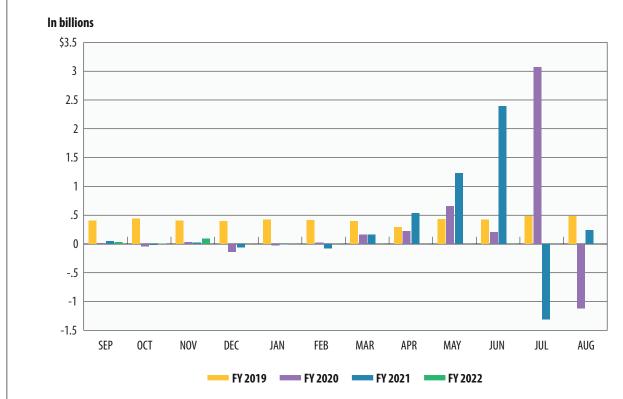


MOTOR VEHICLE SALES/RENTAL TAX





FRANCHISE TAX



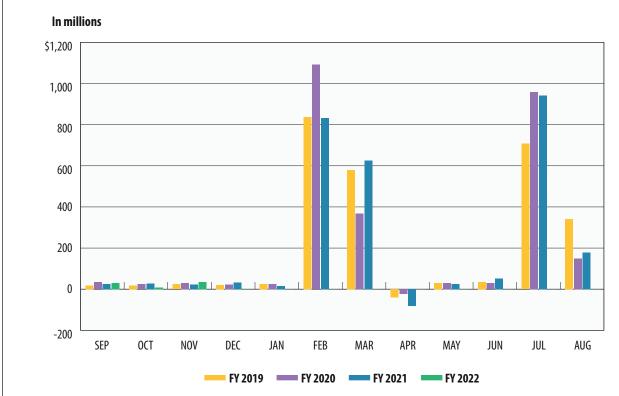


MOTOR FUELS TAXES

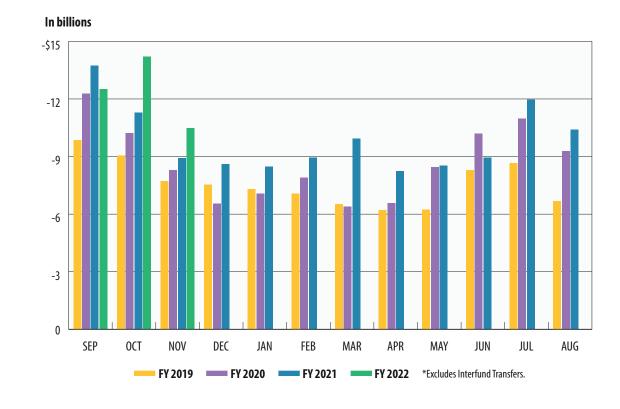

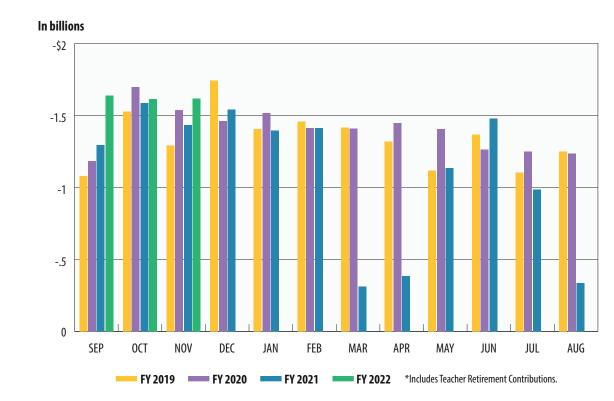




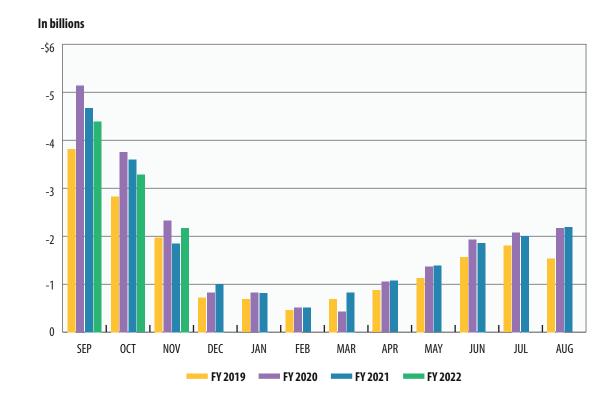




PAYROLL/BENEFITS EXPENDITURES*

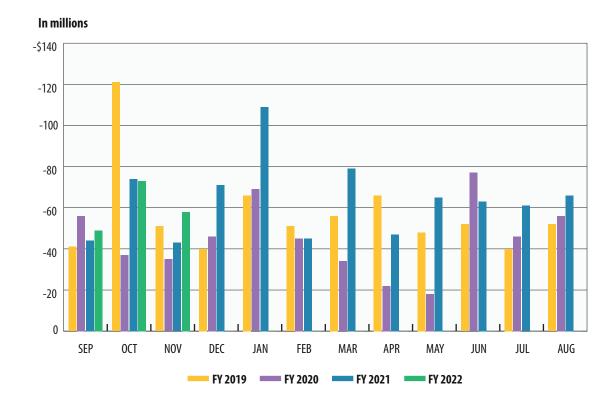






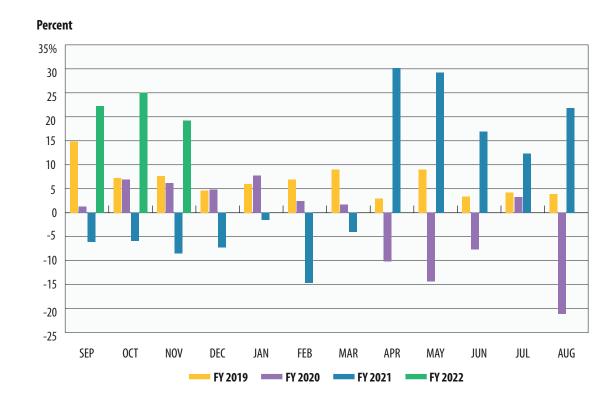


LOTTERY TICKET SALES



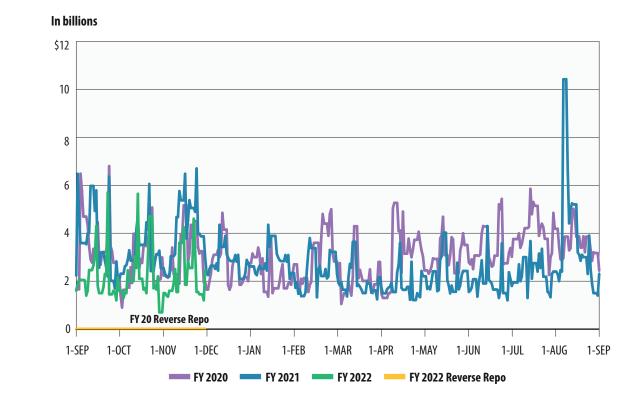


SALES TAX COLLECTIONS (PERCENT CHANGE OVER SAME MONTH PRIOR YEAR)
